

<p>All TCU residence halls except Colby Hall are co-ed. TCU residence halls are all very similar when it comes to room specifications, but each hall has some unique common area features. Most rooms are double occupancy, but there are triple occupancy rooms throughout campus. All halls have lounges for studying and socializing and all halls have laundry rooms.</p>	
<p>All first year halls have community style restrooms, with the exception of Foster, Moncrief and Waits. These three halls have a mix of semi-private and community restrooms.</p>	
<p>Brachman Hall First Year Students</p>	<p>Brachman, located in the Worth Hills part of campus, is home to approximately 155 residents and what a home it is! The hallways often smell of baking cookies coming from the lobby kitchen. The lounge/lobby is a family room for games and the sharing of meals. Most rooms are double occupancy and the typical room dimensions are approximately 11' x 18'.</p>
<p>Clark Hall First Year Students</p>	<p>Roughly 220 students are proud to call Clark home for their freshman year. "Clark Sharks" enjoy the convenience of being centrally located on campus just in between the academic buildings and the Brown Lupton University Union. Most rooms are double occupancy and the typical room dimensions are approximately 11' x 15'.</p>
<p>Colby Hall First Year Students</p>	<p>Colby has a rich history and the residents who live there pride themselves in traditions such as Colby Halloween. Located next to the Brown Lupton University Union, Colby houses 350 first year women, most in double occupancy rooms. The typical room dimensions are approximately 11' x 16'.</p>
<p>Foster Hall First Year Students</p>	<p>Foster is centrally located on campus, is a residence hall rich in traditions of academic excellence and is located next to the Walsh Center for Performing Arts. Students living in Foster enjoy Foster Family Feasts and other events such as the annual "Foster Egg Hunt" and "PB Glee" to name a few. Most rooms are double occupancy and the typical room dimensions are approximately 12' x 18'.</p>
<p>Moncrief Hall First Year Students</p>	<p>Moncrief is centrally located on campus nestled right between the Brown Lupton University Union and the Recreation Center. It's home to athletes and non-athletes with approximately 224 first year residents who enjoy a unique building with double occupancy rooms and some triple rooms. The typical room dimensions are approximately 11' x 15'.</p>
<p>Sherley Hall First Year Students</p>	<p>Not only do the 315 first year residents enjoy the central location that Sherley affords, but they also enjoy their very own movie room and gaming hallway. Of course there are lounges for studying between the hallways of double and triple occupancy rooms. The typical room dimensions are approximately 11' x 15'.</p>
<p>Milton Daniel Hall First Year & Upper Division Students</p>	<p>Milton Daniel, home to the John V. Roach Honors College, houses mostly first year students but also has one floor of upperclassmen that apply to live there. Residents are welcomed home by a majestic "Great Hall" and they can relax or catch a show in the outdoor amphitheater. Milton Daniel has double occupancy rooms and some triple rooms and the typical room dimensions are approximately 11' x 15'.</p>
<p>Waits Hall First Year & Upper Division Students</p>	<p>Waits is centrally located on campus, next to Ed Landreth Hall and Auditorium and home to approximately 211 residents. The rooms are double and triple occupancy and the typical room dimensions are approximately 11' x 18'.</p>
<p>Bellaire Condos Upper Division Students</p>	<p>Bellaire Condos is a quaint community for our junior and senior residents looking for a true off-campus experience of an unfurnished apartment while still enjoying the luxury of an on-campus address. Each unit, ranging from one to four bedrooms, is uniquely different allowing for a truly personalized feel. (Cable, internet and phone not included.)</p>
<p>Carter Hall Upper Division Students</p>	<p>Sitting in the heart of campus, the Campus Commons is comprised of four residence halls, Kellye Wright Samuelson Hall, Amon G. Carter Hall, Teresa & Luther King Hall and Mary & Robert J. Wright Hall, which house 628 upperclassmen residents. Each resident has his/her own bedroom in this suite-style facility with laundry rooms on every other floor. These residents have one of the best "front yards" on campus.</p>
<p>GrandMarc Upper Division Students</p>	<p>The GrandMarc located on West Berry is a unique apartment building that features a variety of apartment options, parking deck, pool, exercise facility and media room. The GrandMarc is privately owned and operated, but was developed in partnership with TCU to meet the growing need for apartment style housing for TCU residents.</p>
<p>Samuelson Hall Upper Division Students</p>	<p>Sitting in the heart of campus, the Campus Commons is comprised of four residence halls, Kellye Wright Samuelson Hall, Amon G. Carter Hall, Teresa & Luther King Hall and Mary & Robert J. Wright Hall, which house 628 upperclassmen residents. Each resident has his/her own bedroom in this suite-style facility with laundry rooms on every other floor. These residents have one of the best "front yards" on campus.</p>
<p>Sandage-McCart Upper Division Students</p>	<p>Sandage/McCart is a small community on the east edge of campus giving residents an on-campus experience with an off-campus feel. Sixty junior/senior residents live in fully furnished 2 bedroom apartments with parking right outside their front door. Each apartment comes equipped with a kitchen, cable, internet and all utilities.</p>
<p>Wright Hall Upper Division Students</p>	<p>Sitting in the heart of campus, the Campus Commons is comprised of four residence halls, Kellye Wright Samuelson Hall, Amon G. Carter Hall, Teresa & Luther King Hall and Mary & Robert J. Wright Hall, which house 628 upperclassmen residents.
