Large dormitory-style

There are ten dormitory-style residences, each accommodating a large number of students. These range from Danielsen Hall with 280 students, to the West Campus area with over 1,800 students. Most residences are coeducational. In most cases, men and women are housed in separate sections of the same floor with separate bath facilities or on separate floors within the residence.

Shelton Hall	Four-person and five-person suite-style rooms (two doubles or a double and a triple). A bathroom is attached directly to one room in each suite, and the residents of the other room must pass through this room to use the bathroom. There are also some private doubles that are not connected to other rooms. Small dormitory-style

Small dormitory-style residences are located in three areas of campus. These brownstones house from fourteen to sixty-five students. They include a number of specialty residences.

East Campus brownstones	Twenty-four to sixty-five students are housed primarily in double- or triple-occupancy rooms, with an occasional single or quadruple assignment.	Some have a common lounge on the first floor or in the basement. TV lounge, Study lounges, Laundry rooms. Most rooms share a common bathroom on the floor; There are approximately 6 students per bathroom.
South Campus brownstones	South Campus residences contain single-, double-, and triple-occupancy rooms, and some suite-style rooms.	Games area, Study lounges Laundry facilities in many residences
Bay State Road brownstones	Fourteen to fifty-one students are accommodated at each address, primarily in double or triple rooms, with an occasional single or quadruple. Most of these residences, which are a favorite with upperclassmen, are coeducational.	A music room is available in The Towers; pool table, and study area are available in Shelton Hall. A number of residences have a piano. Nearby dining rooms at The Towers, Shelton Hall, Myles Standish Hall, and Warren Towers. Most rooms share a common bathroom on the floor.

Apartment-style

Apartment occupancy varies from one to six residents, while size and floor plans vary considerably. All apartments are furnished and equipped with kitchen facilities and bathrooms (though not necessarily a "living room"). Students must provide their own kitchen utensils, cleaning items, and bathroom supplies.

East Campus apartments	One-bedroom apartments for two and studio apartments for one or two.	Facilities in The Towers and Shelton Hall are available to residents between 7 a.m. and midnight; these include pool table, TV lounge, study rooms, and laundry facilities. All apartments contain a kitchen and a bathroom.
South Campus apartments	These apartments include studio apartments for one and two, one-bedroom apartments for two, two-bedroom apartments for three and four, as well as a limited number of multiple-occupancy apartments in which residents have their own bedroom.	Ethernet port for direct access to the campus network and an individual telephone line per resident; study lounge; laundry facilities in many residences; Convenience Points can be used at laundry rooms in 44 Buswell Street and 518 Park Drive. Apartments contain a kitchen and a bathroom.

Student Village


This apartment-style residence houses students with junior or senior class standing. 33 Harry Agganis Way opened in the fall of 2009. The North tower houses juniors and seniors in an apartment-style setting; the South tower houses sophomores, juniors, and seniors in a suite (dormitory-style) setting.
