PFEFFERNUSSE (Traditional German Christmas Cookies)

|--------------------------|----------------------------|--------------------------|
| ½ cup shortening | ½ teaspoon baking soda | ½ teaspoon ground ginger |
| ¾ cup packed brown sugar | 1 tablespoon hot water | ⅛ teaspoon white pepper |
| ½ cup molasses | 3 ½ cups all-purpose flour | powdered sugar |
| 3 drops anise oil | ¼ teaspoon salt | |
| 1 egg | ½ teaspoon ground cinnamon | |

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- Cream the shortening and brown sugar in a bowl until smooth. Mix in molasses, anise oil, and egg. Dissolve baking soda in hot water, then add to the mixture. Combine the flour, salt, cinnamon, ginger, and white pepper. Blend the dry mixture into the molasses mixture until well blended. Knead for a minute until easy to shape. Roll dough into 1-inch balls and place on ungreased baking sheet.
- Bake for 10-12 minutes at 350 degrees, until slightly browned. When cool, roll in powdered sugar.
