## **Suggestions for leading kids in Bible Skills:**

### AT HOME:

- 1. Encourage children to **find** Scripture.
- 2. Take your Bible to **church**.
- **3. Model** the importance of Bible study.
- 4. Guide your children to **participate** in worship.
- 5. Make sure every child has a **Bible**.
- 6. Challenge your school-age children to **name** the books of the Bible.

### AT CHURCH:

- 1. Organize a Bible skill **retreat**.
- 2. Develop a **Bible skill** program.
- 3. Schedule a **parent** meeting.
- 4. Provide **Bibles**.
- 5. Provide daily **devotional** magazines.
- 6. Train children's leaders.
