What Is Next in Ministry?

Be supportive but also help them to approach this journey with humility and a willingness to learn and grow.

navigating the conversation:

- Gain Practical Experience: Discuss the value of gaining practical experience in ministry settings, such as volunteering in church.
- Focus on Spiritual Growth: Emphasize the importance of personal spiritual growth and developing a strong foundation in faith and biblical knowledge.
- Build a Support Network: Encourage teens to build a network of support within your church. This network can offer encouragement, advice, and opportunities to serve.
- Encourage Patience and Discernment: Remind teens that discerning and preparing for ministry can take time and should be approached with prayerful consideration.
