# Marshelle Wilburn - Guide to Navigating the Rainbow: Charting the Waters of Queer Culture

Today's culture is extremely different than just a decade ago. We find ourselves amidst redefinitions of gender, sex, marriage and family. Regrettably, the church has found itself decades behind our changing world and often ill-equipped to have a viable understanding and response to changing times. As leaders seeking to provide a gospel- centered response to a world seeking truth and love, we must ensure that we are equipped with current contextual information and biblical truths that don't change. #### Simone Monroe-Creating A Culture for Developing Leaders

It has long been determined that culture drives everything! If this is true, then the culture we develop with our leadership will determine the direction of the ministry. Creating a culture for developing leaders, and assisting in their maturity, is quite different from the "old school" concept of gathering leaders to do a job. Moving from creating an event to having overall purpose and vision, and establishing values on which ministry is based, is only the beginning. Developing leaders is about growing others, not about being up front, or being recognized as the leader. Learning to major on developing potential, finding their greater purpose, and moving from informing and directives to seeing transformation in those being led, is dependent on the culture of leadership and how leaders are developed. If leadership is more about what happens in the inner life of the leader, then discipleship might be a better word to consider here.

### Martha Lawley- Becoming a Peacemaker: Resolving Conflict God's Way
