

## Session Overview – Spring 2020

Studies based on Never Enough (Ron Blue) and Alone with God (John MacArthur)

SESSION 1:Who Owns It? God owns all "our" resources, we are but God's stewards of those resources. Matthew 25:14-30; James 3:16-17

SESSION 2:Five Wise Principles Wise stewardship is not complicated. Psalm 37:21; Proverbs 10:4; Matthew 6:19-21

SESSION 3: Live Lifestyle spending should be guided by "ahead-oftime" decisions.

1 Timothy 4:4; 5:8; 6:8,17

SESSION 4: Give Generosity—holding money with an open hand and allowing God to use it—is the only way to become free from the grip of money.

Matthew 6:19-21

SESSION 5: Owe Debt Debt carries risk, is often symptomatic of deeper issues, and hinders accomplishing financial goals. Proverbs 22:7,26-27; Luke 14:28-31; James 4:13-16

SESSION 6: Owe Taxes Taxes reflect God's provision for us and are an obligation to be met with wisdom. Mark 12:14-17; Romans 13:1-7

SESSION 7: Grow Meeting long-term financial goals requires intentional action now.

Proverbs 6:6-8; 21:20

SESSION 8: "Our Father" Recognizing God as our Father impacts our whole approach to prayer. Matthew 6:9b

SESSION 9: "Hallowed Be Thy Name" Prayer is first and foremost a recognition of God's majestic glory and our submission to it. Matthew 6:9c

SESSION 10: "Thy Kingdom Come" Prayer seeks the coming of the eternal kingdom and the exalting of its King. Matthew 6:10a

SESSION 11: "Thy Will Be Done"
Prayer focuses on seeing God's will accomplished, not convincing Him to do our will.
Matthew 6:10b

SESSION 12: "Give Us This Day Our Daily Bread" God invites His people to pray for their own needs. Matthew 6:11

SESSION 13: "Forgive Us Our Debts"
The prayer of confession results in forgiveness commensurate with our extending forgiveness to others
Matthew 6:12,14-15

SESSION 14: "Deliver Us from Evil" The fallenness of our world should drive us to pray. Matthew 6:13
