What amazes you the most when it comes to David's victory over Goliath?




READ EPHESIANS 2:1-10.

On the scale below, mark where you are at in your relationship with Christ.




## MOVE

# KNOW THE WORD

## THINK

Every good coach has a playbook and a game plan. The playbook includes Xs and Os for each play to show what each player should do. The game plan is made in preparation to face a certain opponent. The team creates a game plan to attack specific weaknesses of an opponent and to defend against specific strengths of an opponent.

Through His Word, God gives you a playbook for everyday living. Sometimes, though, you may have trouble knowing the game plan because you struggle to see how God's Word speaks to the decisions you make each day.

For example, the Bible doesn't come out and give directions on whether or not you should watch a specific movie, so how can you make this decision based on God's Word?

**READ 2 TIMOTHY 3:14-17.**
