SESSION 1: THROUGH THE WORD

 When we think about what God is like, often our first reaction is to believe God is disappointed, angry, frustrated, and regrets saving us. But Jesus—who is God in the flesh—shows us a very different picture.

SESSION 2: GOD-GIVEN BELIEF

• God can use any means He chooses to draw people to Himself, but He uses ordinary human beings to draw new believers to the kingdom of God.

SESSION 3: GRACE UPON GRACE

• God's grace is an inexhaustible well that will never run dry.

SESSION 4: THE WORD AND THE WITNESS

• As we study the Scriptures, we grow in our adoration, affection, and love of Jesus, and we align our identity with His.

SESSION 5: BEHOLD THE LAMB OF GOLD

• There's an old saying, "God helps those who help themselves." However, nothing could be further from the truth. Jesus came to do what we could not do for ourselves.

SESSION 6: CALLED TO FOLLOW

• Jesus' intention is never for His followers to merely know about Him—He invites us into a lifestyle of knowing Him personally.

SESSION 7: NEW WINE

• We aren't called to be superhuman—we are called to abide in Jesus and trust Him to equip us to do what we can't accomplish in our own strength.

SESSION 8: THE TEMPLE, SPIRITUAL CONSUMERISM, AND JESUS

• As Christians, we have the privilege of knowing Jesus—not just what He does for us—but who He is. There is no higher honor.

SESSION 9: AN INADEQUATE FAITH

• Unlike the rest of us, Jesus cannot be tricked by flattery or lured by praise. He knows what's in people's hearts.

SESSION 10: BORN OF THE SPIRIT

• The Christian life is not simply difficult—it is impossible apart from the Holy Spirit. And God doesn't expect us to attempt it apart from the power of the Spirit.

SESSION 11: A LOVE THAT GIVES AND SENDS

• Our only cure for sin is to look to Jesus and His work on the cross. Only in looking to Jesus can we be saved from our sin.

SESSION 12: OUR PLACE AND MESSAGE

• When we acknowledge Jesus above all, we will have complete joy when we see His kingdom advancing.
