SESSION 1: God Justifies the Ungodly
All are ungodly, but God justifies the ungodly.
Romans 4:5

SESSION 2: Accomplishing Justification God alone accomplishes justification and does so without violating His holy, righteous standards.

Romans 3:21-26; 8:33

Acts 5:30-31

SESSION 3: Grace and Faith
God's grace, not our faith or anything else in us,
accomplishes salvation.
Ephesians 2:8

SESSION 4: Alas! I Can Do Nothing!

Jesus died for us when we were His enemies without strength to accomplish any good.

Romans 5:6

SESSION 5: Repentance and Forgiveness
The forgiveness of salvation comes strictly by
God's work, but will not come apart from
repentance.

SESSION 6: Standing to the Last
Christians persevering to the end is work
accomplished by Father, Son, and Spirit.
1 Corinthians 1:7-9

SESSION 7: Absolute Surrender
The condition for obtaining God's full blessing is absolute surrender to Him.
1 Kings 20:1-4

SESSION 8: The Fruit of the Spirit Is Love Absolute surrender means the Holy Spirit overflows love from us. Galatians 5:22

SESSION 9: Separated unto the Holy Ghost Absolute surrender means the Holy Spirit directs the work of God in our lives. Acts 13:1-4

SESSION 10: Peter's Repentance
Absolute surrender means being humbled before
God so He can transform us.
Luke 22:61-62

SESSION 11: Impossible with Man, Possible with God Absolute surrender means acknowledging we cannot accomplish in our lives what God expects—only He can do that work—and living accordingly.

Luke 18:27

SESSION 12: "O Wretched Man That I Am!" Absolute surrender means moving from wretchedness to obedience, victory, and real holiness.

SESSION 13: "Having Begun in the Spirit"
Absolute surrender means living a Spiritempowered life.
