# **Kindness Stones**

#### **Objectives**

- Children will identify feelings and emotions.
- Children will receive emotional support.
- Children will be aware of the feelings of others.
- Children will build friendships.

#### **Materials Needed**

- Smooth stones
- Paint
- Paintbrush

- Permanent markers
- Paper plate
- Small basket
- Newspaper or butcher paper (optional)

# **Getting Started**

- Gather smooth stones and clean them so they are free of dirt and debris.
- Create a paint palette on a paper plate for the child by squirting three or four colors of paint onto a paper plate.
- For easier cleanup, place everything on top of newspaper or butcher paper.

### **Activity**

- I. Talk to the child about kindness. Ask, Has anyone said something kind to you today? What is something nice that a friend has said to you?
- 2. Give the child a stone and say that this is a special kindness stone that is meant to be painted and shared with friends. Kindness stones help people feel one another's friendship.
- 3. Invite the child to paint the stone. The child can paint the whole thing, only one side, or a pattern.
- 4. Allow the stone to dry and then use a permanent marker to write a message on the stone. It could be "You Rock!" "Thanks for Being a Great Friend!" "I Love You!" "You Are Special!" and so on.
- 5. Place the stone in a basket, along with stones other children have made. Share all the messages.
- 6. Remind the child that in order to keep the paint on the stones, the stones should remain in the basket or indoors.
- 7. Place the basket where everyone can access it. Tell the child that if he or she sees a friend who is upset, sad, or mad, the child can choose a stone and give it to the friend once the friend has calmed down. Or if the child needs a pick-me-up, allow him or her to choose his or her own stone and hold it until the child feels better.
- 8. Remind children that the stones are only for holding. You should keep a stone only for a little while and then return it to the basket for when another child needs it.

# **Extended Learning**

For further exploration of emotions, try our <u>Feelings & Emotions Washable Dolls</u>. These dolls are great for introducing feelings and emotions in a low-level way. Children can use the dolls for dramatic and role play and to act out their feelings.
